The United States of America
 To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:
 Whereas, George W. Scovely, of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has
 deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate
 of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska,
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the
 said George W. Scovely according to the provisions of the acts
 of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An Act making
 further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts
 supplemental thereto, for the East half of the North East quarter
 of section four, and the West half of the North west quarter of
 section three, in township twelve, north of range eighteen
 west of the Sixth principal meridian in Nebraska, containing
 one hundred and sixty-eight acres and fifty-five hundredths
 of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of said
 lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General,
 which said tract has been purchased by the said George
 W. Scovely, Now know ye, That the United States of America,
 in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several
 acts of Congress in such case made and provided, doth
 give and grant, and by these presents do give and grant, unto
 the said George W. Scovely and to his heirs, the said tract above
 described; to have and to hold the same, together with all the
 rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever
 nature, therunto belonging, unto the said George W. Scovely and to
 his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur,
 President of the United States of America, have
 caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General
 Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

 and eighty five and of the Independence of the United States the
