Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John Haug has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South half of the North West quarter of Section twenty two in township nine north, of range thirteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing eighty acres,
