Certificate of the United States of America.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas James Tarmann, of Buffalo County Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made, by the said James Tarmann, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto for the lots numbered four, five and six, and the south-east quarter of the North-west quarter of section twenty six, in township nine North of Range thirteen west, of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and fifty acres and twenty hundredths of an acre, according to the Official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said James Tarmann

Now, know be, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said James Tarmann, and to his heirs, the said tract above described; To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said James Tarmann and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the tenth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty five, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and ninth.
