South half of the South West quarter and the South half of the South East quarter of Section eight in Township nine, North of Range seventeen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Nellie Taylor the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Nellie Taylor and to her heirs and assigns forever.
