Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Fannie D. Thornton formerly Fannie D. Borders has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the West half of the North East quarter of section eighteen in Township ten North of Range fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Fannie D. Thornton the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Fannie D. Thornton and to her heirs and assigns forever.
