To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: It knows, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874 and June 14, 1878, "To Encourage the Growth of Timber on the Western Prairie" the claim of Barthlett Turner has been established and duly consummated, in conformity with law, for the south-east quarter of section thirty-four, in township two north of range fifteen west of the sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Barthlett Turner the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Barthlett Turner and to his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed, Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty six, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundredth and tenth.
